Courtney's Story: Finding a different career path with Dundee City Council

NEBOSH General Certificate Scholarship for NEBOSH Diploma

In October 2018, Dundee City Council employed their first Modern Apprentice in Occupational Health & Safety. Courtney Bayne, at 17, had just left school and impressed the interview panel with her passion, genuine interest and knowledge.

Courtney achieved her SVQ3 in Health & Safety in record time and was appointed a permanent post as Trainee Health & Safety Adviser. As part of workforce and succession planning, Courtney was supported to undertake further development and completed the NEBOSH General Certificate. This allowed her to be promoted to Assistant Health & Safety Adviser. During Review and Personal & Professional Development discussions, Courtney agreed to progress her learning through the Technical Modern Apprenticeship at SVQ4 and has just recently completed this.

At the same time, Courtney was encouraged to apply for the inaugural Michael Adamson Scholarship to undertake the NEBOSH National Diploma for Occupational Health & Safety Management Professionals which, like the SVQ4, is a degree level qualification and a route to a Master's degree. Courtney again impressed the panel with her application and is one of only 2 UK candidates to receive the Scholarship. The prestigious Scholarship is named in memory of Michael Adamson who lost his life in a preventable workplace incident. On Thursday 4 August 2005, Michael Adamson left for work and didn't make it home. He was 26 years old. Michael suffered a fatal electrocution at the 'all handson deck' job he'd been called to. The aim was to get a sports store and gym complex ready for handover to a client the next morning before penalty clauses kicked in.

His 'big sister' Louise, is now dedicated to sharing Michael's story and campaigning for better occupational health & safety everywhere.

Courtney said, "I was coming to the end of my school years and I wasn't sure what career path I was going to take. All my friends wanted to go to University and knew exactly what they wanted to study. After much deliberation, I decided I wanted to pursue a career in health and safety as my granny was also involved in a workplace incident which could have been prevented. I told my friends and they laughed at me, as they thought I was joking, as this isn't a typical career choice for a 17-year-old. I didn't let this stop me. I soon realised that it may be harder than I originally thought, as health and safety isn't a course you can study locally at University. However, I was determined, so began looking at alternative routes. I came across a health and safety Apprenticeship with Dundee City Council. I applied, was successful and appointed as Health and Safety Modern Apprentice.

Despite being satisfied with the route I chose, I would have loved to have had the opportunity to gain a University level qualification in health and safety, whilst being in full time employment. The NEBOSH scholarship and SVQ 4 now allows me to attain this goal!"

Courtney is well known and respected in the Council as a Health & Safety professional.

Courtney's achievements were recognised by the Courier Business Awards as the winner in the Apprentice Award category on 30th October 2021.

Dylan's Story: "I liked the idea of learning on the job."

College with the guys 2017 (that's me in the middle red top!)

Dylan started as a Modern Apprentice with Dundee City Council IT Service in 2015 and completed his 2-year Apprenticeship in 2017_{3.} He attended Dundee & Angus College on day release for some of the technical aspects but the bulk of his SVQ was achieved in the workplace based round the actual work tasks he was undertaking. As a very practical person and kinetic learner, Dylan felt the vocational qualification would better suit his learning style and provide invaluable, real life work experience. On completing, Dylan gained a post as IT Assistant in the Infrastructure team and when the Graduate Apprenticeships at University of Dundee commenced that same year, he was offered a space with the first cohort on the IT for Business Management Honours degree programme. Dylan <u>said</u> "I never really considered degree level study – didn't think it was for me". He was encouraged to apply and seized the opportunity.

Initially in the Infrastructure team, Dylan moved to the Security team in 2018. In this role he undertakes cyber security tasks, analysing threats in real-time and taking important measures on mission critical systems, making <u>decisions</u> and suggesting guidance to pass on to our customer base and the business stakeholders. Dylan's important work helps the organisation meet its objectives on a <u>number of</u> levels including continually improving and innovating in our IT provision.

Dylan has developed his skills and knowledge significantly <u>during the course of</u> his Graduate Apprenticeship programme. In moving to the Security team, he has picked up new processes and procedures in very tight time scales. His enthusiastic willingness to learn and undertake new tasks has broadened this knowledge, <u>ability</u> and confidence. An example of this is that of SSL Certificates which help secure the Council's numerous websites and systems. Due to circumstances within the team Dylan, who only had a little involvement in the Certificate process, was asked to pick this up. In a very short space of <u>time</u> he demonstrated the ability to complete the full process for the creation\renewal and installation of SSL Certificates, this allowed him to improve his knowledge and skills and now the team has an additional person able to do this work.

Dylan now has a lead role in our AI Cyber defence platform, this work will fit well with his MSc study and will bring further benefits not only to Dylan as he gains new skills and knowledge, but also to the IT team and the Council where he will have an important role into the future and meeting organisational objectives in cybersecurity setup and protection of our systems.

During the Covid 19 pandemic restrictions, and because of his knowledge and confidence, Dylan volunteered to accompany an IT Officer colleague to different sites around the city helping to rectify a severe security issue. This involved visiting over forty different locations around the city, replacing various pieces of <u>equipment</u> and ensuring the business was kept running at these sites. Much of this work was sheltered accommodation requiring different configuration setup and special considerations. This task was crucial to allow Wardens to continue their work - this is a credit to Dylan's professionalism, work ethic and passion for the work.

With increased confidence, Dylan has taken over roles from colleagues on securing websites via certification creation and moving forward, ensuring these servers are secured to the highest levels of cryptography which allows the websites to run seamlessly for members of the public and employees alike. Other tasks he is responsible for include the scanning of the council's infrastructure, making sure that vulnerabilities are patched proactively, guaranteeing our estate is kept secure; working on firewalls and web servers making access available for the departments in order to maintain the Council's frontline services.

Dylan would agree that gaining his Honours degree is his biggest achievement in work and is looking forward to the Graduation ceremony in November. Dylan has a wonderful personality and is an excellent communicator – a priceless skill in dealing with customers who are often frustrated by IT issues, Dylan's calm and dependable demeanour is very reassuring in troubled times. He has brought a fresh outlook and enthusiasm to the team, his new ideas and suggestions coming from his study and on-going experience.
