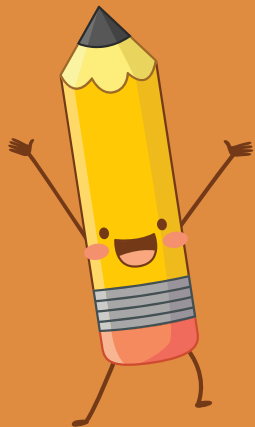

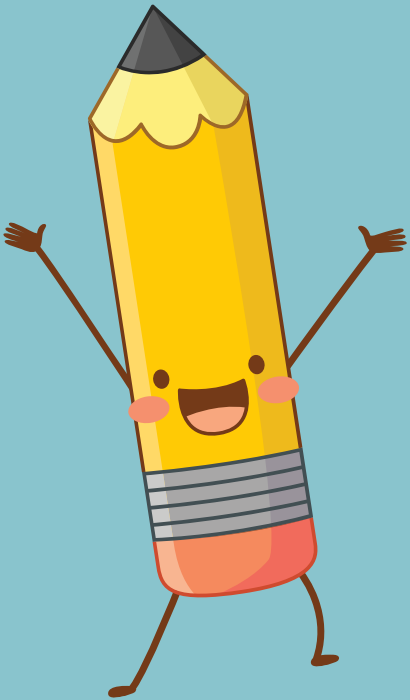

Some information about your Timetable (we know getting your timetable is an exciting time)



In S1, all learners follow a timetable with 33 periods over the week



Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday are our longer days and have 7 periods. On these days, we finish at 3:40pm



Thursday and Friday are our shorter days with just 6 periods and on these days, you will finish at 2:50pm



For some subjects, like Maths and English, you will have up to 5 periods spread across the week.



For others, such as Business and Administration, you will have 1 period a week

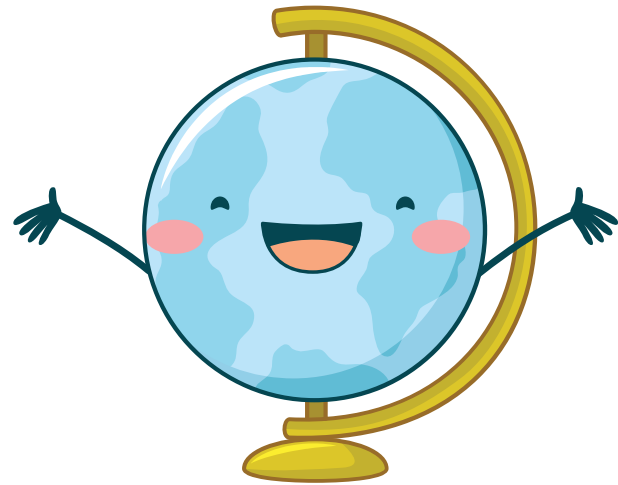

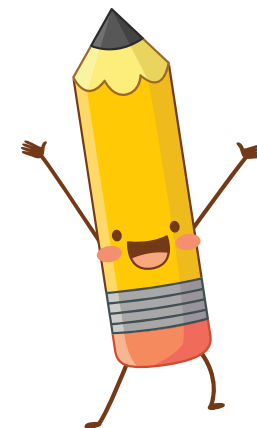
However, in addition to our 5 Values, we thought we would share 5 'top tips' for being successful at secondary school...

1. BE YOURSELF!



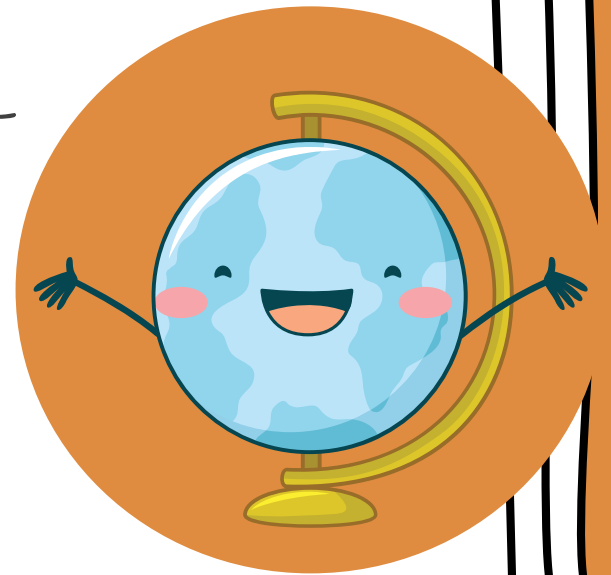
Often, the years you spend at secondary school are where you really find out about yourself and grow into a young adult.

Embrace what makes you unique and be confident and let yourself shine!



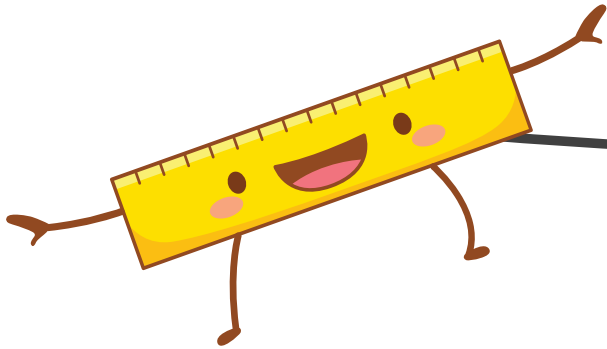
2. Bouncebackability

- This can be called 'resilience' or 'grit'
- It basically means that when things get tough – you get tough!
- Instead of walking away from challenges, you try harder and succeed
- Everybody has times at school – primary and secondary – where they want to give up
- Knowing you can do it means you will do it!





3. Kindness



Every single person you meet: the lollipop person, the lady in the shop, Harry Potter (well, he isn't real, but still), your teachers, your friends – all have their own worries.

The tiniest bit of kindness towards people can make a **HUGE** difference to their lives.

If you are kind to people – you will get kindness back in return.



4. Effort & Enthusiasm

- Work hard – it sounds simple, and it kind of is!
- Some learning is challenging but give it everything you've got
- The teachers and support staff are there to help – let them know if you need help
- Get to know your classmates – they are all feeling the same as you are
- Get to know your teachers and ask if there are any extra curricular activities you can join if you like the subject
