Last week we had a 4 day visit from the Inspection Team to find out what progress we had made as a school since the last Inspection in November 2016. The team spoke to parents, staff and pupils and visited many classes during their visit. The Team acknowledged many of the improvements we have put in place such as the Craigie Leaning Standard, the way we track and monitor pupils across their school journey and they noted some examples of high quality learning, teaching and assessment. I could not be more proud of the pupils who went out of their way to share positive experiences they had in Craigie High School.
